monitor, inspection, and evaluation assist the organization in executing various tasks with effectiveness, efficiency, and economy. Monitor, inspection, and evaluation is a process of continuous information collection for the purpose of assessment, in order to determine whether the progress of the work is moving toward the predetermined goals and objectives, as well as to identify various impacts caused by the implementation of work activities.

1. monitor, Inspection, and Evaluation



Mechanisms

monitor, inspection, and evaluation mechanisms are tools for measuring work progress toward achieving of implementation and to serve as a basis for management to evaluate work progress relative to the targets defined in the plan.

1.1. monitor and Inspection

Work monitor and inspection refer to the process of regular collection, analysis, and assessment information to make timely and appropriate decisions, ensuring that work is executed with efficiency and effectiveness. The purpose of inspection is to measure progress and changes in situations or activities to verify whether work performance is in alignment with the defined plans.

1.2. Evaluation

Evaluation is a system of data collection and analysis to assess the strengths and weaknesses of plan implementation, followed by making improvements for greater efficiency. Generally, evaluations are conducted by management upon the completion of activity implementation; however, Evaluations may also be conducted at the mid-point of activity implementation.





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2. Improvement

To ensure that the organization's operations function smoothly, the organization shall continuously refine its operations in alignment with current circumstances. Improvement is the act of making tasks better by utilizing the foundation of past implementation experiences as lessons learned for refinement. Improvement is undertaken not only to enhance performance but also to prevent the recurrence of the same issues.



3. Key Components for Monitor, Inspection, and Evaluation Mechanisms

The key components for monitor, inspection, and evaluation mechanisms include clear reporting regarding operations management, data collection mechanisms that facilitate progress reviews and serve as both a basis and a means to compare progress and achievements against planned targets, a fundamental basis for data collection structured within an evaluation framework, clear mechanisms for reporting and utilizing the results derived from monitor, inspection, and evaluation for decision-making, and sustainable planning that are predicated on specific data, management, analysis, and reporting.
